We currently have an opening for a Habitat Stewardship Coordinator. This is a project-based temporary position responsible for Coordinating the Habitat Restoration Project, which has a completion date of December 31, 2022.

Responsibilities:

- Develop a S.A.Y. Aquatic Habitat Restoration Program for Chilliwack Creek, Aitchelitz Creek, and interceptor ditch
- Engage community members for input and feedback and participation
- Develops work plans to restore and protect aquatic habitats
- Working with stakeholders along waterways, plan and execute work based on the engineering assessment of the flow capacity, capacity constraints, and clean water initiatives to address issues and implement improvements
- Coordinate and lead engagement with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans
- Develop and deliver training for community members to build capacity for the Aquatic Restoration Program for the S.A.Y. communities
