# BC CODES UPDATE FROM SAY BUILDING INSPECTOR

SAY communities adopted the BC Building Code for implementation in our community and has overseen the construction of many homes and buildings using this as the minimum to ensure safe and sustainable buildings. Last year, changes were made to the code to implement the 'Step Code', which we have at this time declined to adopt until more information is known on the impacts to costs. Following that, a proposed new version of the BC Building Code has been announced and is expected to be approved on March 8.

BC-specific changes effective March 2024

More complete and specific language for constructing extended rough-ins for radon subfloor depressurization systems adopting cooling requirements to provide one living space that does not exceed 26 degrees Celsius retaining existing ventilation requirements for systems serving single dwelling units.

# SKOWKALE APRTMENT BUILDING CONSTRSTUON

As well 7249 Temelhem Cr. PL received their building permit for the 20-unit 2 story apartment building in Mid-January. Recently last week the footings for the apartment building have been placed and building is underway.

Winter & Family topics were covered in Halq'emeylem Class and activities for language enrichment included Indian Ice Cream, oven bread, fish hash & more. We are coming to the end of our introductory period for language class and will be moving into a more structured immersion class going into the new fiscal year. Participants this year have been at a beginners level.

## SKOWKALE HOUSING UPDATE

Skowkale is currently underway construction of five small homes geared towards elders or singles. Applications opened in early December 2023 with a submission deadline of January 19,2024. All that submitted applications will receive communications from the SAY Lands office on January 31,2024 regarding next steps. Small homes are planned to be move-in ready mid-summer 2024. The SAY Lands office will provide an update in December 2024 regarding the apartment building and townhomes, at this time they are not accepting applications and there will be no waiting list.

### **CURBSIDE COLLECTION PROGRAM**

Please have your items curbside no later than 7:00 am on collection day

- Sq'ewqéyls Scheduled collection occurs Tuesday (Sq'ewqéyl Zone A) Thursday (Sq'ewqéyl Zone B) and 7:00 am and 5:00 pm.
- Our service provider is Emterra and our program mirrors the City of Chilliwack's
- If you do not receive collection by 5:00 PM, please notify Property Manager; Jesse Fraser.
- Households were provided with a starter set of bins, any additional bins can be purchased as needed by the household.
- Compostable Waste (food waste, food-soiled paper and yard waste) is collected weekly from Green Carts (120L)
  - In addition to your green cart, your can place up to 10 EXTRA yard waste bags or bundles per week.
  - o Green Carts are registered to the address
- Recycling is collected weekly (unlimited containers, up to 121L ea)
  - The following items are not accepted: Blue Bags, soft stretchy plastic bags & overwrap, foam packaging, chip bags, Ziploc, Batteries, electronics, light bulbs, paint cans, other hazardous waste.
- Garbage is collected bi-weekly (Two Bags or up to two 121L containers every second week
  - o Extra Bag tags can be purchased by homeowners from Save-on-Foods as needed
- Glass is collected bi-weekly
  - Remember to rinse containers, remove lids & place in your grey bin

Suites/Rental units are not included as separate households unless the address is set-up separately & is member inhabited.

# DOG WASTE COLLECTION

Recently the SAY Lands office has been receiving complaints about dog waste not being properly taken care of. A friendly reminder to all that your animals should be leashed at all times and you are required to clean up after them. At this time we would like to remind all that our SAY building, community cemetery and parks are not pet friendly areas, signage will be posted soon. Be a good neighbor and clean up after your four legged friend, and if you see someone not following guidelines please remind them!

I am the youngest child of Mark and Brenda Point. I am a Sto:lo/Coast Salish on my Father's side, Anishinaabe, Cree and Metis on my Mother's side. I am born and raised and registered member of Skowkale First Nation in Chilliwack BC. From a young age, I was raised and instilled with the philosophy that we need to get educated and strive to build ourselves as a strong sovereign nation, while remaining rooted in our indigenous identity, culture, and values.

I am currently working as an administrator for All Nations Mestiyexw, an Indigenous collective, leading the way for meaningful Indigenous participation in the licensed cannabis industry, with a strong focus on supporting First Nations to participate in the cannabis sector and increase nation-owned revenue sources. Prior to working with All Nations, I worked as a personal banker at the RBC Royal Bank, where I managed the indigenous lending portfolio for on reserve mortgages and chaired the BC Royal Eagles. This group has a mission was to increase awareness on indigenous matters and history, improve the indigenous employee experience, and promote RBC as an employer of choice for indigenous peoples.

Since 2015, I have participated in many committees under the Skowkale Governance model, including, election code, policy, finance, governance, comprehensive community planning and housing. In the fall of 2023, I accepted an appointment as a board member for Sto:lo Community Futures, an organization with a mission to provide Indigenous entrepreneurs and First Nation communities within S'ólh Téméxw, with a wide range of business and economic development programs and services.

I graduated from the University of the Fraser Valley in 2019, where I earned a bachelor's degree in business administration, with a major in Human Resources. Furthermore, I hold a certificate from the Ch'nook Aboriginal Management program from the UBC Sauder School of Business. I am honoured and excited at the opportunity to partake and support the Tomiyeqw Development Corporation and our mission to create economic prosperity for our nation, and our pursuit of building a sustainable, sovereign Skowkale First Nation.


